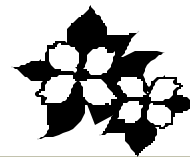

Elections ahead, the DOD says...

DOD Personnel Involvement in Political Activities

-- Military members don the uniform in order to ensure the civil liberties of American citizens and its allies

-- However, military and federal civilians are subject to rules regulating their own involvement in political activities

-- The constraints on military members and civil service employees ensures an open, democratic process and a nation that's governed by the people, not by tyranny or martial law

-- Several rules govern the integrity of the political process: DODD 1344.10 (www.dtic.mil/whs/directives/corres/html12/d134410x.htm) for active duty service members, NGB All-States Memo 05-002 for National Guard members in Title 32 AGR status, and the Hatch Act (www.osc.gov/ha_fed.htm) for federal civilians, Title 5 employees and Military Technicians. These rules keep military and civil service employees out of partisan politics and ensure the workplace remains politically neutral

-- The rules do not prohibit military members and federal civilians from participating in politics. All military and civilian personnel are allowed to vote, sign nominating petitions, express their personal opinions about candidates and issues, attend political rallies or meetings; Also, all federal employees can make contributions to political organizations or candidates

-- However, participation in political activities can't be done as representatives of the armed forces. Also, military and federal civilian employees may not use their position to

influence or interfere with an election, engage in political activity on the job, in a government vehicle or while wearing an official uniform

-- Additional do's and don'ts differ based on whether the individuals are active duty service members or civil service employees

Military acting in official capacity:

-- May not attend political meetings or rallies in uniform

-- May not make public political speeches

-- May not serve in any official capacity in partisan groups

-- May not participate in partisan political campaigns or conventions

-- May not generally campaign for a political office. Traditional National Guard members may generally campaign for and hold a political office when not in a National Guard status

-- May not participate in any radio, television, or other program or group discussion as an advocate for or against a partisan political party, candidate or cause

-- Must not use Government facilities or resources for furthering political activities

Civilians:

-- May actively participate in and speak before political gatherings or serve as officers or political parties or partisan groups

-- Are permitted to manage campaigns, distribute literature, write political articles or serve as a spokesperson for a party or candidate

-- May campaign for a political office as long as it's a nonpartisan election

Minutes of the Executive Council Meeting 29 July 2006

1. President Smith called the meeting to order at 1000 hrs. The meeting was held at the Charlottesville Armory, Charlottesville, VA. PP Gary Webb administrated Invocation.. President Kenny Smith led the Pledge of Allegiance.

2. Secretary Kuykendall conducted the roll call, Pres Smith, 1VP Wagoner, 2VP White, 3VP Hunter, Sec Kuykendall, Treasurer Green, Financial Sec Berryman, Sgt at Arms Billmeyer, PP Webb, Exe Sec O'Neill and Representatives from Area I, III, V, VII, VIII, XI, XIII, XV, and XVII were present. A quorum was present.

3. The minutes of 28 Apr 06 Executive Council Meeting held at the Conference Center Holiday Inn Tanglewood, Roanoke, VA was presented by PP Webb and passed around the room.

4. Treasurer's Report – Treasurer Green reported a \$5,000.00 CD showing in the VaA/ANGEA account but was not sure if it is actually there. He is to have the account checked to validate if the monies are correct and then present a formal report at the next Executive Council Meeting. PP Webb made a motion to stay with Oppenheimer Mutual Funds and to setup new controlling members to handle Oppenheimer Mutual Funds. The committee is to have a minimum of three members. PP Webb's motion to stay with Oppenheimer was second by CSM ® Bob Kuykendall. The committee members are Chairman CSM Borowski, Treasurer Green, CSM Cliff White, and PP Webb.

5. Committee Reports:

a. **Membership:** 1VP Wagoner indicated current membership is 1162.

b. **Legislative:** 2VP White reported \$900.00 was in the budget for Legislative actions. He recommends sending out Letters and Posters for new membership.

c. **Constitution/By-Laws:** No formal report rendered.

d. **Resolutions:** No formal report rendered.

e. **Retiree Affairs:** No formal report rendered. Mr. Snapp indicated he would like to obtain a current listing of retirees from Mr. Price at State Headquarters.

f. **Audit:** No formal report rendered.

g. **Ventures, Inc.:** Ventures Committee Rep Bob Kuykendall reported a check should arrive very soon from Ventures Inc in the sum of \$18,750.00 for Jul 06 – Jul 07.

h. **Cardinal News Letter:** PP Webb indicated that all notes had been forwarded to Brent Taylor, but has not been able to make any phone contact. PP Webb mentioned looking at a possible new Web Site for VaA/ANGEA.

i. **2006 Conference Report:** 1VP Wagoner reported that around \$1200.00 would be returned to the Association of unused funds from the 2006 Conference held at the Conference Center Holiday Inn Tanglewood, Roanoke, VA. He reported the total cost of the Conference was around \$10,000.

j. **2007 Conference Report:** 2VP White reported the Sheraton West Hotel has been locked in for the 2007 Conference and that the hotel would like \$500.00 to reserve the Hotel. 2VP White reported he had 40 Pre-Registrations for the 2007 Conference he was holding to establish a bank account. "T" shirt sales will be turned over to Association members for sales. 2VP White indicated that no Guest Speaker had been locked in. CSM Yancy wants to lock in a Golf outing as the Golf Course has changed dates to accommodate the Association for our conference dates. CSM Yancy mentioned that a main event will be the "Friday Casino Night". CSM Huffman mentioned that he expects good participation from the Air Guard and is working with Command Chief Master Sergeant John Iorio.

6. Executive Secretary's Report: SFC Shawn O'Neill reported he is making up new membership files as the old files are out of dates in format. PP Webb mentioned that \$2,000 had been allocated for office supplies and equipment. Some new office equipment is being obtained for the Association Executive Secretary to maintain reports and membership files. SFC O'Neill indicated he has only two packs of membership applications and would need to purchase more. SFC O'Neill indicated he wasn't sure of new application to be processed, but would get with SFC JJ St. Clair to get any updates.

7. EANGUS Area II: Area II Chairman Wade provided the following written report to PP Webb:

a. EANGUS is the Enlisted Association of the National Guard of the United States, and Area II includes the states of Virginia, North Carolina, Kentucky, Ohio, Pennsylvania, West Virginia, Delaware, Maryland, District of Columbia and Title 10 NGB. I am responsible for the states of VA, WV and NC.

b. The next big event is the EANGUS Conference in Salt Lake City, Utah. All pre-registrations have been transferred to Salt Lake City. I hope everyone got their motel rooms arranged through Director Rip Preston. The dates for the conference are 19-23 August 2006. If anyone has a problem, tell President Smith and he will get back to me. There has been some discussion of Area II going in with Ohio for a hospitality room during the conference. Each state would pay \$200 that would take care of the room, drinks and food. VA needs to make a decision on this. Also VA usually takes ham for ham biscuits at the areas hospitality on Tuesday night. Need your decision on this and how you will get it there. EANGUS is also requesting donations to the Silent Auction for the EANGUS Building Fund and for the EANGUS Auxiliary. We usually take a VA ham for each of these silent auctions.

c. This is election year for EANGUS with many candidates running for office. As of now we have two running for President, three running for Vice President, two for Secretary and one for Treasurer. The candidates will be visiting the Area II caucus meetings to present themselves.

d. As of 7 Jul 06 our Virginia Army/Air National Guard Enlisted Association was leading in the membership numbers for Area II. Virginia is to be congratulated for leading Area II in membership with EANGUS showing 1212 members.

It doesn't look like many units are using the USAA free membership for individuals promoted to E-5 or E-6. CSMs, CMSs and 1SGs need to award this to their soldiers and airmen that are promoted.

e. EANGUS has a National Guard Soldier and Airmen Emergency Relief Fund that is available to any member of the Army and Air National Guard who has experienced catastrophic financial hardship and personal property loss while serving as a member of the National Guard of the United States. The emergency grant will be disbursed on a first come, first served basis based on funds availability.

f. Sorry I could not be with the executive council today as I will be returning from Myrtle Beach, SC tonight. Keep up the good work for the association and if I can be of any assistance please contact me. Hope to see many of you in Salt lake City. Respectively submitted SFC (Ret) Joe Wade EANGUS Area II Director.

3VP Hunter indicated our AREA will be at the Radisson Hotel. The hospitality room will be run by Ohio. A motion was made by Sergeant-At-Arms Billmeyer and second by PP Webb to donate \$200 to Ohio for a hospitality room. Motion carried. PP Webb recommended three Virginia Hams be purchased by the VA Association and mailed or taken to Salt lake City, Utah for EANGUS Conference.

8. Old Business. PP Webb recommended we restructured areas to be aligned with the new BCT structure and setup a committee to review each Area designation of current units and what Battalion's are in each Area. CSM Huffman recommended the committee be made up of 1SG Billmeyer, CSM Yancy, CSM White, CSM Johnson, SFC Wagoner, SSG Constant, and SGM ® Bowers. PP Webb named CSM Johnson be the Chairman of the committee. It was mentioned that Area XVII members move back to there original Area. A recommendation was made to leave an option to the Area XVII member to stay in Area XVII or move back to there original Area. This business will be tabled at the next Conference in 07.

9. New Business. PP Webb indicated the following would be attending the Area II Conference in Salt Lake City, Utah: PP Webb, 1^{SG} White, CSM White, CSM Huffman, Mr. Snapp, SGM ® Bowers, MSG Berryman, SFC ® Golladay, CSM ® Bob Kuykendall, MSG ® Vaught, President Smith, and CSM Borowski. 3VP Hunter briefed an update on EANGUS Conference covering the facilities, events, and meals in Salt Lake City. CSM White announced that the business meeting attendees will attend in ACU or BDU uniform for the business meeting. PP Webb indicated that ten State Conference Pins would be given to each member attending the Area II Conference for trade or gifts. The balance of left over Pins will be sold at 50 cents a Pin. PP Webb stated MSG ® Emerson has a new design for the 07 Conference pins. PP Webb made a motion and was second to go ahead and purchase the new pins at 70 cents a piece for 1000 pins. Motion was carried. 3VP Hunter recommended that PP Webb, Financial Secretary, and Treasurer proceed with the budget for 2007-2008. PP Webb has received two letters from candidates requesting support while running for office in Area II Conference at Salt Lake City, Utah. The next Executive Council meeting will be held on 28 October 2006 at Fort Pickett, Blackstone, VA in Building 301.

10. A motion was made at 1330 hrs to adjourn the meeting. It was 2d, carried. No further business was discussed and the meeting was

Earhart promoted to brigadier general

CAMP ATTERBURY, IN (September 23, 2006)

Douglas Earhart, commander of Multi-National Task Force - East for the KFOR 8 rotation, was promoted to the rank of brigadier general on Sept. 22 at Camp Atterbury, In. Earhart was promoted by Maj. Gen. John A. Yingling, the deputy commanding general for the First United States Army, at the MNTF-E tactical operations center where the unit is conducting the second of three command post exercises in preparation for their deployment to Kosovo.

"My personal family can't be here today, but my Army family is here," Earhart said after the promotion ceremony. "I appreciate all the hard work, dedication and effort that the Soldiers of the task force have put into this mission so far, and I just ask that you continue to do so."

The unit will continue to train at Camp Atterbury until early October. After a period of block leave, they will then deploy to Germany for a final readiness exercise. In November, they will conduct a relief in place with the KFOR 7 rotation and assume authority for the mission in early December.

MNTF-E is part of Operation Joint Guardian, the NATO-led international force known as the Kosovo Force (KFOR) responsible for establishing and maintaining security in Kosovo. The organization entered Kosovo on June 12, 1999 under a United Nations mandate, two days after the adoption of UN Security Council Resolution 1244.

Earhart was born in Alexandria, Va., and earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Political Science from Virginia Commonwealth University in 1986. He earned a Master of Arts degree in Higher Education Administration from Appalachian State University in 1993 and a Master of Science degree in National Security Strategy from the US Army War College in 2003. Earhart resides in Springfield, Va. with his wife and daughter.

He served in various command and staff assignments throughout his career, both in the 29th Infantry Division and on active duty at National Guard Bureau, FORSCOM and Headquarters Department of the Army. Before assuming his current position, he served on the Army Staff at the Pentagon as Deputy Director, Army Quadrennial Defense Review Office.

Additional Facts about KFOR 8

MNTF (E) operates under the flag of the Army National Guard's 29th Infantry Division and is part of a larger NATO-led international force known as the Kosovo Force (KFOR). KFOR is responsible for establishing and maintaining security in Kosovo. The organization entered Kosovo on June 12, 1999 under a United Nations mandate, two days after the adoption of UN Security Council Resolution 1244. KFOR troops come from 35 NATO and non-NATO nations.

The United States contingent of MNTF (E) is made up of approximately 1,500 personnel. The National Guard of Virginia and Massachusetts provide almost two thirds of those Soldiers, while other National Guard Soldiers from 22 different states and Puerto Rico provide the additional personnel. Men and women from California, Colorado, Georgia, Iowa, Illinois, Indiana, Louisiana, Massachusetts, Maryland, Michigan, Mississippi, North Carolina, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia, Wisconsin and West Virginia will be deploying as part of the task force.

The task force is made up of one infantry battalion, one cavalry squadron and one aviation task force, but will also have medical support, military police, explosive ordnance disposal, civil affairs, psychological operations and military intelligence.

KFOR 8 conducts final training exercise then deploys overseas

The final training event in the United States for Kosovo Force 8 (KFOR 8) was conducted October 2 through October 6. The unit's departure ceremony was held on October 8 at Camp Atterbury.

Soldiers from KFOR 8 have been training at Camp Atterbury since early August and deployed to Germany for a final training exercise.

KFOR 8 is a brigade-sized task force that will conduct peace-enforcement operations in Kosovo as part of the NATO-led Kosovo Force that has been in the province since 1999. Five multinational brigade-sized task forces make up the KFOR, and KFOR 8 will be assuming authority for the Multinational Task Force (East) area of operations.

"This is a great mission," said BG Douglas B. Earhart, the commander of MNTF (E) for the KFOR 8 rotation. "The people of Kosovo have been through some horrific experiences, and we are committed to helping them. We are organized, equipped and trained to help maintain the peace as they go through their rebuilding and reconstruction efforts. We will have an opportunity to make a positive impact on their lives and help them live in a safe and secure environment."

MNTF (E) is made up primarily of United States National Guard units from 17 states and Puerto Rico, as well as units from the active component of the U.S. Army and U.S. Army Reserve. The United States is the lead nation for MNTF (E), and the contributing nations are Armenia, Greece, Lithuania, Poland, Romania and Ukraine.
