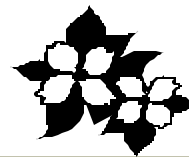

EANGUS AREA II, DIRECTOR'S REPORT

EANGUS is the Enlisted Association of the National Guard of the United States, and Area II includes the states of Virginia, North Carolina, Kentucky, Ohio, Pennsylvania, West Virginia, Delaware, Maryland, District of Columbia and Title 10 NGB. I am responsible for the states of VA, WV and NC.

If you attended the EANGUS National Conference in Salt Lake, Utah, you enjoyed a great conference and saw a new slate of officers elected to lead EANGUS. President Frank Lever, the new president, has taken charge, with a promise to increase membership and develop ways to get each state president involved to take care of our enlisted soldiers and airmen.

As an EANGUS director, I was elected to serve two more years. I serve on the Finance Committee, the Membership Committee and this year was asked to serve as the EANGUS Chaplin.

At our EANGUS executive council meeting 26-29 October 2006, the finance committee developed a budget of \$1,240,107.00 that was approved by the executive council on 28 October. This budget included funds for a membership workshop that the President wanted to get his membership program off the ground. The membership workshop will be at CRTIC Air Guard Facility, Gulfport, MS, 23-25 Feb 07. Each state CSM, CCM, Enlisted Association President and Membership Chairman are invited to attend. There is no registration charge for the workshop and housing on base is very cheap. For this workshop to be a success, we must have the key players from each state in attendance and involved.

To go along with the membership challenge, the EANGUS National Office is looking into purchasing a new secure on-line Membership Service Program. This new program would include a new website design, on-line reports, sign up members on-line, password protection, automatic renewal notices, Auxiliary on line sign up and reports, event registrations to include National Conferences, Area Caucuses, State conference, workshops and any other meetings and Legislative information. This program would be a big boost for the states in that the President or his designated representatives can go in at any time for membership reports, status on upcoming events, and send out meeting notices, just to name a few.

The Area II Mid-Winter Conference is upcoming 2-4 February 2007 at the Holiday Inn-Capitol, 550 C Street, S.W., Washington, DC 20024. The rooms are \$119.99 + tax per night and blocked under the block code: EAN. Reservations must be made by 2 January 2007 to get the above room rate. The conference registration fee is \$10.00/person.

The EANGUS National Conference is scheduled for 12-15 August 2007 in Oklahoma City, OK. Registration forms are available on line at eangus.org. The state of VA has requested 20 rooms in the same motel for the conference. Oklahoma is using a lottery system to place states in motels and after the motel is selected, each registered attendee will receive an e-mail for credit card info to reserve their room. President Lever has set the uniform for business meetings to be Class B for delegates and Coat & Tie for retiree delegates not in uniform.

I notice the VaA/ANGEA membership numbers are declining and that disappoints me. I know that we are capable of obtaining better numbers and I am willing to work with the leadership to achieve this. I feel that we must get area representatives appointed, educated and working with the unit representatives, supported by the CSMs, CCM, 1SGs and all senior NCOs, and Commanders to achieve membership goals. 1SGs should make every promoted E-4 and E-5 aware of the USAA free membership. We must promote our State and National Enlisted Associations and the benefits and opportunities they provide. Working together we can achieve much.

Virginia Army National Guard announces strength figures

RICHMOND, VA – Maj. Gen. Robert B. Newman, Jr., the Adjutant General of Virginia, announced the Virginia National Guard had a very successful year in the area of strength management. Newman state, "This is the largest increase in assigned strength the Virginia National Guard has had in many years."

The Virginia Army National Guard had a net gain of 432 Soldiers during Fiscal Year 2006 which ended Sept. 30, 2006. Newman said the gain in assigned strength during Fiscal Year 2006 is a Virginia Army National Guard success story

Newman said the assigned strength of the Virginia Army National Guard was 7,466 Soldiers as of Set. 30, 2006 and it began Fiscal Year on Oct. 1, 2006 with 7,034. He attributed the increase in the Virginia Army National Guard's assigned strength to enhanced recruiting incentives, an increase in the number of production recruiters working in Virginia, and most importantly, many of Virginia's Guard units having returned from overseas deployments.

Newman pointed out that Gov. Kaine and the General Assembly had been very supportive of the men and women of the Virginia National Guard and that this support was a positive influence on his Soldiers' decision to remain in the Guard. Gov. Kaine was instrumental in ensuring tuition funds were available for Guardsmen to attend summer semester this past summer. Additionally Gov. Kaine and the General Assembly supported a state funded \$2,000 reenlistment bonus and a \$500,000 appropriation for the Military Family Relief Funs.

Newman pointed out that the most effective recruiters the Guard has are its Soldiers. When Guard units are deployed, the men and women of those units are not available to recruit. Additionally, Newman suggested that the types of missions the Virginia National Guard has been involved in over the last year have had a positive impact on strength.

"Supporting the Hurricane Katrina, Southwest Border, and Ernesto missions is a strong motivator for many people to enlist in the Guard," Newman said. He went on to say, "Many of our men and women enlist because they want to serve not only this great nation but also out Commonwealth. The Virginia National Guard gives them the opportunity to do just that."

According to Newman, the Fiscal Year 2006 strength goal for the Virginia Army National Guard was 7,555 Soldiers. While the Virginia Army Guard fell 89 Soldiers short of the National Guard Bureau goal Newman said, "The Virginia Army Guard has made significant progress from earlier this year when it was over 300 Soldiers short of the goal.

I am pleased with the progress we have made and look forward to reaching and then exceeding the 7,555 mark. I have no doubt that we will accomplish this."

He concluded by saying, "It's not where we are; it's where we are going and all of our trends are heading up. All of the Virginia Army Guard has pulled together to make this happen. I am proud of all of these guys".

VIRGINIA ARMY GUARD SOLDIERS ORDERED TO ACTIVE DUTY

BLACKSTONE, Va. - Major General Robert B. Newman, Jr., the Adjutant General of Virginia, announced that 177 Soldiers of the Virginia Army National Guard will enter active federal service at their home armories on January 4, 2007. The Guardsmen are currently scheduled to travel to their mobilization station, Ft. Dix, N. J. after a short period of duty at their home armories. Units affected by this mobilization are:

These Virginia Army National Guard Soldiers are being ordered to active federal service for 18 months beginning January 4, 2007 in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. Virginia Army/Air National Guard Enlisted Association Minutes of the Executive Council Meeting 18 November 2006

1. President Smith called the meeting to order at 1000 hrs. The meeting was held at Building 301 Fort Pickett, Blackstone, VA. Ronnie Emerson administrated Invocation. President Kenny Smith led the Pledge of Allegiance.

2. President Smith conducted the roll call, Pres Smith, 2VP White, 3VP Hunter, PP Webb, and Representatives from Area I, IX, X, XIII, and XVII were present. A quorum was present.

3. The minutes of 29 Jul 06 Executive Council Meeting held at the Charlottesville Armory, Charlottesville, VA was presented by President Smith and PP Webb and was noted that the minutes was on page 4 of the Cardinal. Motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes. Minutes were approved.

4. Treasurer's Report – Treasurers report was presented by PP Webb for Treasure Green. Report accepted and seconded. Motion passed. Currently there is about three (3) checks that have not cleared the bank that will change the final total. Some deposit slips have not shown through transfers of position between past Treasurer Bassetti and current Treasurer Green. Gene Atkinson received a check from the Oppenheimer Mutual Funds. A stop payment was requested on that check and it was reissued and sent to President Smith for \$22,387. The check was forwarded to Treasurer Green for deposit. The Oppenheimer Mutual Funds have been reinvested under Templeton Stock category at not cost for 12 months in Class C stock. The names on the account are PP Gary Webb and Treasurer Dennis Green. A Motion was made and seconded to approve the Treasurer report. Report was approved.

5. Committee Reports:

a. **Membership:** President Smith reporting for 1VP Wagoner indicated current membership is 1117. How do we improve membership?

b. **Legislative:** 2VP White requested help on legislative issues in Richmond. We currently have no real issues needing attention. Ronnie Emerson recommended the Appropriation Committee be thanked for the support that has been given in the past. 2VP white reports \$800.00 in the budget for Legislative actions. He also recommends printing Posters for new membership to post in armories.

c. **Constitution/By-Laws.** No formal report rendered.

d. **Resolutions** 3VP Hunter reports no formal resolutions have been received from the membership. During the National Conference at Salt Lake it was reported that out of 37 received resolutions that 30 have been approved.

3VP Hunter recommends the 30 resolutions approved at the national level be reviewed to see if our Constitution and By-laws need to be amended or updated.

e. **Retiree Affairs** No formal report rendered. Ronnie Emerson reported that long time member George Vault had lost his wife Freda in October 06. Financial Secretary Bill Berryman sent flowers for the Association.

f. **Audit:** President Smith reported the 2006 Conference Financial Report is ready to submit to CSM RET Bob Kuykendall.

g. **Ventures, Inc:** Ronnie Emerson reported that Ventures had its Annual meeting in Richmond, VA in September 06. No Officers changes were made from the current Officers. President Smith reported the Association would receive \$15,000 from Ventures on 1 July 2007.

h. **Cardinal News Letter:** PP Webb indicated the Cardinal News Letter has been published, but had not been mailed to members of the Association due to illness of the mailer and that the Executive Secretary has been in school. PP Webb ask that all Committees submit reports along with pictures of events, (i.e. Conferences, Awards, special events) to be published in the Cardinal.

i. **2006 Conference Report:** President Smith reported the 2006 Conference Financial Report is ready to submit to CSM RET Bob Kuykendall. Once the Financial Report is approved the 2006 Conference will be closed.

j. **2007 Conference Report:** 2VP White reports he is disappointed with the show of support for the Conference preparation for 2007. Most individuals showing are from the Air Guard. I'm looking at moving the meetings from Richmond back to Fort Pickett and having the meeting at a later time during the day hoping for better participation. The meetings will be conducted each month now until the 2007 Conference. We have Friday night festivities laid on with Casino, a DJ, and Barbecue. Saturday night will be the Banquet. During the Banquet we will copy the National Conference. We will spend a lot of time recognizing Air soldier's and Army soldier's for achievements. There will be no DJ or Band on Saturday Night.

The monies normally spent for the Band or DJ will be split between the Air and Army for hospitality. 2VP White is unsure if the Officers Conference will be having a Golf outing. He indication that the enlisted side normally only has about eight teams. CSM Huffman believes it is more like fifteen teams.

This new program will include a new WEB Site Design, Online Reports, Signup Members Online, Password Protection, Automatic Renewal Notices, Auxiliary Online Signup, Reports, Event Registration to include National Conference, Area Caucus, State Caucus, Workshops, and any other Meetings and Legislative Information. This Program will be a big boost to the State in that the President or his representative can go in at any time and get Membership Reports, Status of upcoming events, and send out meeting notices just to name a few. If we purchase this thing it will be something each State can use. The cost will be between \$120,000.00 and \$150,000.00.

d. Area II Mid Winter Conference is upcoming 2-4 February 2007 at the Holiday Inn Capital, Washington, D.C.

Room Rates are \$119.00 plus tax. Rooms are blocked under BLOCK CODE "AN". Anybody that is interested can see Joe Wade or President Smith for the registration form. Registration must be made by 2 January 2007 to get the above room rates. Cost of Registration is \$10.00 per person.

e. EANGUS National Conference is scheduled 12-15 August 2007 in Oklahoma City. Registration forms are available online at EANGUS.org. The State of Virginia has requested 20 rooms in the same Motel as the Conference. Oklahoma is using a Lottery system to place States in Motels. After the Motels Collection, each register attending will receive an email for Credit Card information to reserve a room.

f. President Lever has set the uniform for the Business Meeting to be Class "B" for all Delegates and for Retirees not in uniform is Coat and Tie. He has said that EANGUS is a Professional Organization and he's determined to so look like a Professional Organization.

g. I noticed that the Virginia Army/Air National Guard Enlisted Association membership numbers are declining and that's a disappointment. I know we are capable of better numbers and I am willing to work with the Leadership to achieve this. I feel that we must get Area Rep's appointed, educated, and working with Unit Rep's supported by the CSM's, SGM's, 1SG's, Senior NCO's, and Commander's to achieve Membership Goals. First Sergeants should make every promoted E4 and E5 aware of the **USAA FREE MEMBERSHIP**. He must promote the State and national Enlisted Association and the benefits and opportunities they provide. Working together we can achieve most.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the Area II report. Report was approved.

8. Old Business: 2008 Conference update. Currently the Motel site (Holiday Inn) for the 2008 Conference in Portsmouth, Virginia is scheduled for destruction. CSM Huffman recommended we look at moving to Virginia Beach, Virginia and maybe hold at the Double Tree Motel. We have with us the Auxiliary President. The Auxiliary President reports a decline to only 37 members. PP Webb indicated that Enlisted Members are Associate Members to the Auxiliary. Joe Wade asked about the status of restructured areas to align with the new BCT structure. PP Webb indicated the committee needs to make the recommendation and get back to the Association. Ronnie Emerson stated it may take a change to the Constitution and By-Laws to restructure the Area's as it will reduce the numbers of Area's.

9. New Business. President Smith stated that Area II Rep Mr. Wade has already reported of the upcoming meeting of Area II Mid Winter Conference on 2-4 February 2007. I have passed out registration forms or I can have 1SG Hunter make more copies if needed

Mr. Wade also reported the Membership Workshop will be held at CRTC Air Guard facility, Gulf Port, Mississippi 23-25 February 2007. President Smith asked who might be attending. The Association can fund the travel.

President Smith mentioned the EANGUS National Conference is scheduled 12-15 August 2007 in Oklahoma City. I have passed out application sheet, map, and some memorial stuff for the National Conference. Mr. Wade indicated the State of Virginia has requested 20 rooms in the same Motel as the Conference. 2VP White indicated we're looking at maybe taking a Commercial Bus to the National Conference.

CSM Huffman talked to Kenneth Smith about the locations of the Officers Conference. Mr. Smith said the Officers are looking at having there Conference one year in Richmond, VA and then the next year in Virginia Beach, VA. The Conference would rotate back and forth from Richmond to Virginia Beach. The Conference in Virginia Beach would be held somewhere up on 54th Street.

The new WEB Site will have the Application for Scholarship's. Each Scholarship application requires three letters of recommendation.

PP Webb reported the Pin's for next year's Conference has been completed. We have 1,000 pins for next year's Conference as well as taking pin's to the National Conference. Thanks to MSG Emerson for completion of the pins.

The next Executive Council meeting will commence at 1000 AM on 27 January 2007 at the Sheraton West Hotel, Richmond, VA.

10. A motion by Ronnie Emerson was made at 1245 hrs to adjourn the meeting. It was 2d, carried. No further business was discussed and the meeting was adjourned

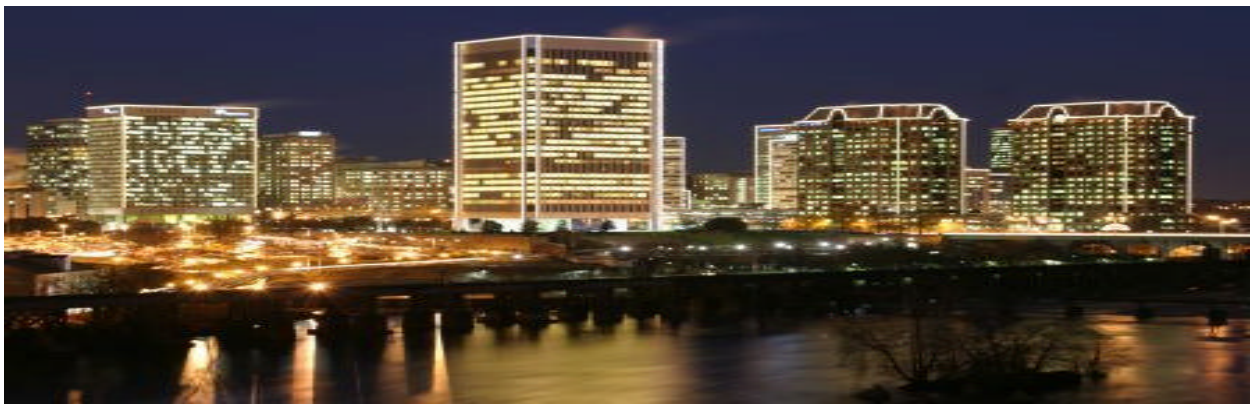
