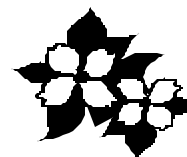

## Virginia Enlisted Soldiers Continue to Excel

Across the country National Guard soldiers continue to provide units for security for this nation and abroad. Virginian's are deployed both in Afghanistan, Iraq and stateside.

Our enlisted soldiers and units are performing at a high level and many are being recognized for these outstanding accomplishments. To many times these feats are over shadowed by less stellar feats.

In the past year we have had units like the 1031st Transportation Company that were deployed to FT Lee and provided security at all the entrances and was recognized by the post commander for setting a high standard of performance that other units would have a hard time achieving. Their sister unit, the 1032nd, deployed to Iraq and logged 2.3 million miles about 1 million more than any other unit at that time. The 1030th Engineer's while deployed in Iraq had eleven units under its command about 600 soldiers. Four of those units were active component, three reserves and the other four National Guard truly representing one army. Elements of the 429th FSB were deployed to FT Meade and were recognized for their professionalism and were requested to extend their tour. A small group of soldiers from the 1st 116th Infantry to FT Monroe and during their tour their soldiers won soldier of the month and soldier of the quarter on three different occasions.

SPC Ryan Koniak of A/2-116th INF displayed one of the best individual performances this past year he competed in the State Soldier of the Year competition where he won not only the state level but First US Army East and finished five points out of first place at the First US Army competition. Additionally, he graduated from PLDC, won the Expert Infantry Badge and graduated from airborne accomplishments by our soldiers and units. ### **Army Plans To Keep Iraq Troop Level Through 2006, Year-Long Active-Duty Stints Likely To Continue**

The Army expects to keep its troop strength in Iraq at the current level of about 120,000 for at least two more years, according to the Army's top operations officer. While allowing for the possibility that the levels could decrease or increase depending on security conditions and other factors, Lt. Gen. James J. Lovelace Jr. told reporters that the assumption of little change through 2006 represents "the most probable case." His projection came as members of Congress pressed the Bush administration for a more detailed explanation of its plan for an eventual withdrawal, and as the administration is about to seek approximately \$80 billion in additional military spending for operations in Iraq and, to a lesser extent, in Afghanistan.

## Bill would boost life insurance, death benefits Services

Despite Pentagon concerns about being overly generous with military pay and benefits, a bipartisan plan is taking shape that would dramatically increase military life insurance coverage and death payments.

Sen. Jeff Sessions, R-Ala., a member of the Senate Armed Services Committee and longtime champion of military benefits, is working with defense officials on what he calls the Honoring Every Requirement of Exemplary Service, or HEROES, Act.

This measure, in the process of being crafted into a formal legislative proposal, would:

- Increase the maximum Servicemembers' Group Life Insurance coverage to \$400,000, up from the current \$250,000.
- Provide up to \$150,000 of that coverage at no cost to service members once they enter a combat zone. There is no free coverage under current law.
- Boost the current \$12,000 gratuity paid to the families of troops who die on active duty to \$100,000 if the death occurs in combat. This provision would be retroactive to the start of Operation Enduring Freedom combat in October 2001.

Combined, the three increases would cost about \$460 million, and it is unclear where the money would come from.

Aides said Sessions scaled back his plan after discussions with senior defense officials, but he still hasn't reached formal agreement with the Bush administration on whether money for the proposal would be set aside in either the 2005 supplemental budget or in the regular 2006 annual budget.

Defense and service officials also are growing increasingly worried about how they will cover the cost of bonus and special pay increases that are

expected to be required to avoid problems with recruiting and retaining skilled troops, congressional aides said.

As part of the 2005 Defense Authorization Act, signed Oct. 28 by President Bush, Congress ordered the Pentagon to include funding for death benefits increases in the 2006 budget or justify why the increases were not necessary.

In talks with the Pentagon, one idea included in the 2005 law has been dropped, aides to Sessions said. Lawmakers had proposed that in addition to any other death benefits, surviving families of service members who die on active-duty receive one year of the member's basic pay, and two years of pay if the death occurred as a result of combat. Pentagon officials argued the extra pay was not needed because the other increases were already generous, those aides said.

Sessions said he plans to introduce a detailed bill Jan. 24. With Sen. Joseph Lieberman, D-Conn., as a chief co-sponsor and with Rep. Terry Everett, R-Ala., planning to push a similar measure in the House, Sessions hopes for expedited approval, aides said.

Major benefits improvements traditionally are folded into the annual defense budget. Sessions aides said the measure could be approved more quickly as stand-alone legislation or as part of the supplemental funding bill expected to cover ongoing costs of the war in Iraq for the rest of fiscal 2005.

## Thousands haven't paid insurance premiums, spouses covered but payroll deductions weren't taken

About 9,000 service members who have not been paying premiums for their spouses' Family Servicemembers' Group Life Insurance are in for an unpleasant surprise: The government says they may owe hundreds of dollars or more for back premiums.

Those affected, according to the Defense Finance and Accounting Service, include 1,958 airmen, 4,842 soldiers and 2,048 sailors. Figures for the Marine Corps were not immediately available, DFAS officials said.

The amount of the debts varies by individual, because monthly premiums vary depending upon the age of the spouse, but many are likely to be in the hundreds of dollars.

About 10 percent of those affected are married to other military members, but others are involved, too, including a number of National Guard and reserve members, said Steve Wurtz, deputy assistant director for insurance for the Department of Veterans Affairs.

Officials at the Office of Servicemembers' Group Life Insurance, overseen by the Department of Veterans Affairs, are working with defense officials to get a sense of the full extent of the problem, said Steve Wurtz, the VA's deputy assistant director for insurance.

Wurtz said the amount of lost premiums is unknown, but "probably in the millions of dollars."

VA officials began to recognize the problem with the deaths of some spouses who were covered but whose service members were not paying premiums because the spouses weren't properly enrolled in the Defense Eligibility Enrollment Reporting

System (DEERS).

DEERS identifies the eligibility of family members for military benefits and is linked to the military payroll system.

The Defense Finance and Accounting Service taps the DEERS database for information on family members. If a spouse is not registered in DEERS, the finance service will not trigger deductions for Family SGLI premiums.

Wurtz said SGLI paid claims even if premiums hadn't been paid — which was the case in about 10 percent of spouse deaths. About half the premium nonpayments dated back to the beginning of the Family SGLI program in November 2001.

SGLI pays claims for about 750 spouse deaths per year.

The upshot, Wurtz said, is that the Defense Department may issue a directive reinforcing that all married members must register their spouses in DEERS — even if they're married to other service members. About 10 percent of the troops identified by DFAS for nonpayment of premiums are married to other service members.

By law, the maximum family coverage of \$100,000 is automatic unless service members decline or reduce the coverage for their spouses in writing through their personnel offices. Despite attempts by defense officials to publicize those rules, some people say they were not informed.

"The law comes down on the side of better protection," Wurtz said.

Monthly premiums for \$100,000 in coverage range from \$6 to \$54, depending on age.

Wurtz said automatic coverage is designed to "protect members from administrative oversight."

## Virginia Army/Air National Guard Enlisted Association Minutes of the Executive Council Meeting 30 October 2004

1. President Webb called the meeting to order at 0900 hrs. The meeting was held at the Bedford Armory. The Invocation was conducted by PP Wade. Ronnie Emerson led the Pledge of Allegiance.

2. Secretary Glasscock conducted the roll call, Pres Webb, 2VP Atkinson, 3VP Johnson, Sec Glasscock, PP Wade, Sgt at Arms Jeffries, Exec Sec St Clair and Ventures Rep Kuykendall were present. Representatives from Areas I, II, III, IX, XI, XIII, IXV, & XVII were present. A quorum was present.

3. The minutes of the 31 Jul 04 Executive Council Meeting in Charlottesville were presented by Sec Glasscock. A motion was made to "approve the minutes of the 31 Jul 04 Exec Council". 2d, Motion carried.

4. The Treasurer's Report – Pres Webb presented Treasurer Bassetti's 3d Qtr 2004 hard copy of the report to the members present. There was some discussion concerning the 2004 conference expenditures. Discussion involved an explanation of expenditures to "New River" for engraving. A motion was made to table the approval of the Treasurer's Report until the next meeting so that the details of specific trophy expenditures could be provided, 2d, carried.

5. Committee Reports:

a. **Membership:** Current membership is 916 members. Current new membership applications are very good, CSM Huffman sent in 16, plus 86 new due to E4-E5 and E5-E6 promotions from the 1<sup>st</sup> Bde. Pres Webb mentioned that by a review of EANGUS One year membership criteria that we actually picked up 102 members. Pres Webb mentioned that USAA pays \$10.00, with \$9.00 going to EANGUS and \$1.00 back to us.

b. **Legislative:** No formal report rendered. 2VP Atkinson mentioned that there are no major legislative issues. He mentioned that LTG Blum spoke at the organization in pertinent issues.

c. **Constitution/By-Laws:** No formal report rendered.

d. **Resolutions:** No formal report rendered.

e. **Retiree Affairs:** No formal report rendered. There was continuing discussion about how to reach retirees. Mr. Price from VAPA is to furnish list of retirees.

f. **Nominating:** No formal report rendered.

g. **Audit:** Audit Committee Chairman Bob Kuykendall provided a formal report for the Audit of the 2002 & 2003 Conferences. The only major issue from the 2002 Conference that there is a \$50.00 check that has not been cashed. All records for the 2003 Conference were presented for audit. The 2004 Conference is almost wrapped up with \$5,366.71 on hand. There is \$500.00 in refunds due members from the adjusted conference costs. Discussion revisited the issue that following the close of the Business session at the Conference the question was posed to the

floor as to whether or not any member objected to the excess created by the adjusted conference costs be donated to the Jeffries family to help offset large medical and related costs and that on one objected.

h. **Ventures, Inc.:** Ventures Committee Rep Bob Kuykendall provided a formal report. Discussion included mention of \$30,000.00 distribution approved for Jul 05-Jun 06 for each association. There was some discussion about Long and Foster and a proposed clothing line.

i. **Cardinal News Letter:** Verbal report included continued discussion progress and potential of the web based newsletter. Among other issues discussed was the need for more input for the newsletter to be sent to the Cardinal editor Brent Taylor. Pres Webb discussed the bulk mail set up for non-profit mailings. Discussion continued with assignments made to all executive council members for newsletter input, other input could come from Area Representatives.

j. **2005 Conference Report:** Exec Sec JJ St. Clair presented a verbal report. The conference preparation is proceeding well. The hospitality room is on the 1<sup>st</sup> floor. Exhibitors are starting to register. Discussion continued with issues concerning the CSM's hospitality room. There was further discussion concerning the location for the 2006 conference and years beyond.

k. **2006 Conference Report:** No Formal report rendered. There was discussion concerning the location for the 2006 conference and years beyond. Discussion followed concerning obtaining a contract for the 2006 contract, with a possibility of the conference at the Roanoke Wyndham or possibly Norfolk. Discussion included the possibility of the Association taking over the conference duties until the deployments are over, too much strain on Commands. Further discussion included our conference being at the same location as the officers.

6. Executive Secretary's Report: No formal report. Discussion included the necessity to get the life membership forms on the website. Exec Sec St.Clair strongly recommends against using the EANGUS credit card system, recommendation is that we have our own credit card system to register members. A motion was made to proceed with a credit card program, 2d, carried.

7. EANGUS Area II: Area II Chairman Wade provided a written report. His report included a review of the EANGUS Conference in Louisville and EANGUS election of officers. Also highlighted were the impact of mobilizations and their effect on the Guard. It was noted that the Area II mid-Winter conference will be hosted by the VaA/ANGEA at the Wyndham Hotel in Roanoke 18-20 Feb 05. Motion to accept the report, 2d, carried.

8. Old Business. Discussion included the need to provide compensation to the Webkeeper Brent Taylor in the amount of \$100.00 per quarter. A contract is to be for one year then review for continuation. Motion made, 2d, carried. Additional discussion included the need to modify the Jeffries Fund letter in the newsletter.

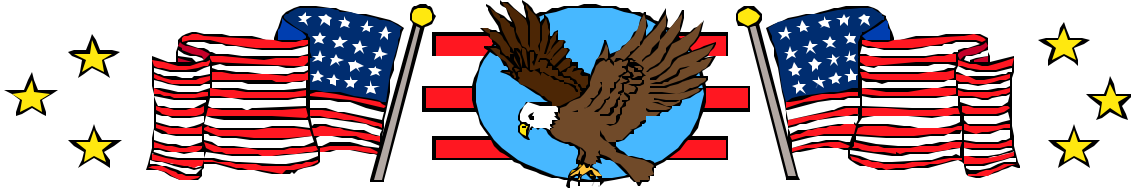
