This will require many soldiers to be retrained in new MOSs, relocate to another unit or Case the Colors on their current unit and stand up a new one as in the 1/246th FA becoming the 429th FSB. The problem as with anything new is getting the correct information flow to all our soldiers. Once the transformation is completed and soldiers are fully trained and units are functional we will be a stable force.

So how do we overcome retention and transformation obstacles? I believe all leaders have to keep the soldiers fully aware of the implementation plan and how it's being executed to include family members through the Family Support Groups. Governor approves Virginia Army Guard restationing plan

Virginia Gov. Mark Warner has approved the Virginia Army National Guard's restationing plan that will transform the Army Guard in the Commonwealth to help it better meet the challenges facing today's military. Under the restationing plan, Virginia will change where some units are located and what kind of units are in each armory location as new units are created, some existing units are reorganized, and some units are eliminated.

The transformation in Virginia is part of a larger transformation process taking place throughout the Army as it converts its force structure to the Army's Modular Force. The change is taking place both among active duty and reserve component organizations.

"The important thing to know in all of this transformation is that every Soldier in the Virginia National Guard has a home," said Maj. Gen. Claude A. Williams, the Adjutant General of Virginia. "A Soldier might have to train for a different specialty or in some limited cases drive to a different armory, but there is a space for every face in the Virginia Guard. This transformation is a great opportunity for the Virginia Guard, and I am confident we have the leadership in place to take advantage of these new opportunities."

According to Col. Mike Coleman, the Virginia Army Guard's senior operations and training officer, the Virginia Guard developed a state command plan for how to reorganize the units in the state based on guidance and directives from National Guard Bureau and the United States Army. That state plan was then used to develop a restationing plan to determine the most effective way to position units and personnel within the state.

Coleman explained that a number of factors were taken into account when the State plan was developed. The Guard wanted to have units in the right places to continue to recruit and retain quality soldiers, and wanted to provide a variety of options for female soldiers since certain units and jobs are not open to them. It was also of critical importance for the Virginia National Guard to be able to accomplish the second part of its dual mission to provide military assistance to Virginia's civil authorities in times of need.

Among the key unit changes are the addition of military police units, the creation of a transportation battalion headquarters to oversee Virginia transportation assets, and a robust logistics organization to provide the necessary support functions for the numerous types of units throughout the state. Also, one of Virginia's infantry battalions will convert to a reconnaissance organization, and there was no significant loss of engineer capabilities.

Engineer and military police personnel can be especially helpful with Virginia's mission of military support to civil authorities. For example, in the wake of Hurricane Isabel, the Virginia Guard deployed personnel into the Tidewater area to clear roads, provide traffic control assistance and increased security to help protect communities and business plagued by power outages.

The transformation will provide additional opportunities for soldiers in the Virginia Guard in a number of ways. For example, Williams said that there will be Guard jobs in military police and engineer units that align with civilian careers in law enforcement and heavy construction equipment.

Williams acknowledged that the transformation will create a certain degree of turmoil as units move and soldiers begin the process of training for a new specialty area. According to Col. Kim Dillon, senior military personnel officer for the Virginia National Guard, a special personnel transition department has

December 1, 2005 --- Soldiers of the 129th Field Artillery Detachment, Virginia Army National Guard returned to a homecoming event at the Virginia National Guard Armory, 5901 Beulah Road, Sandston, Va. after having served in Iraq in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom on December 3, 2005. The soldiers completed administrative processing for release from active federal service at Fort Sill, Oklahoma before returning to the Sandston armory.

Approximately 16 Soldiers of 129th Field Artillery Detachment entered active federal service on September 27, 2004 and deployed to Ft. Sill, Okla. where they completed preparation for deployment to Iraq.

December 9, 2005 --- Soldiers of Battery B, 2nd Battalion, 111th Field Artillery, Virginia Army National Guard returned to their hometown, Farmville, Va. on December 13, 2005 after having served in Iraq in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. Their homecoming event was held at Willett Hall, Longwood University, Farmville, Va. The soldiers were released from active federal service.

Approximately 182 Soldiers of Battery B, 2nd Battalion, 111th Field Artillery entered active federal service on October 17, 2004 and deployed to Ft. Dix, N. J. where they completed preparation for deployment to Iraq in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. After serving in Iraq for approximately one year these Virginia Army National Guard Soldiers returned to Ft. Dix on December 5, 2005 completing administrative processing for release from active federal service.

New Adjutant General Appointed

Governor-elect Tim Kaine announced that Robert B. Newman Jr., who has served as Governor Warner's deputy for commonwealth preparedness, will become the adjutant general of the Virginia National Guard. Newman, a brigadier general in the Virginia Air National Guard, will be Kaine's chief adviser on military matters.

"I'm going to elevate the role of the guard," Kaine said at a news conference in the governor's Cabinet room. "Their state role is a critical element in homeland security."

been established within the military personnel office to address the many issues associated with this transformation.

Coleman said the transformation is going to take some time to accomplish, and it is still too early to have exact start and end dates for when the transformation will take place. "By Sep. 1, 2006, our goal is to have our final unit organizations in place, Soldiers reassigned to their new units, the training identified for those soldiers and the necessary equipment ordered," Coleman said.

Senior leaders in the Virginia Guard have been working on the plan for months, and it has involved a great deal of negotiations between Virginia and the senior leadership at National Guard Bureau. Williams said he was very pleased with the end result, especially since Virginia did not see a reduction in their overall personnel end strength. Virginia will also keep all of its armories open, except for one in Pennington Gap. Use of the armory there has dwindled in recent years, and any personnel assigned to that armory will be able to attend drill in nearby Gate City.

Authorized personnel force structure for the Virginia National Guard is a constantly changing figure, Dillon explained. The needs of the Army changes on a frequent basis, and as a result, the necessary number of personnel to meet that force structure changes to meet those needs.

Under the new force structure system taking effect with the transformation, the Virginia Guard is authorized to have 7,586 personnel, and the Guard actually has a goal higher than that.

"We are supposed to exceed our authorized strength in order to maintain our units at the highest state of readiness possible," Dillon explained. "We will always have a pool of soldiers not available for mobilization because they have not

completed basic training, their job specialty training or have medical or some other issue."

The end strength goal that the senior leadership of the Virginia Guard has established is 7,700 personnel, and that is what the Guard sets as a benchmark for its training, recruiting and retention efforts.

Congress Improves Benefits for Military Personnel (further details in the next issue)

Graham/Clinton/DeWine/Leahy Secure TRICARE for National Guard and Reserve- -Washington, December 28, 2006

The United States Senate has approved the Fiscal Year 2006 Defense Authorization bill.

The legislation improves benefits for military personnel including a provision to expand TRICARE to all drilling reservists.

Senators Graham, Clinton, DeWine, and Leahy have worked together and with others to expand access to health care for members of the National Guard and Reserve who are playing an ever-increasing and historic role in the global War on Terror noting that Guardsmen and Reservists now make up approximately 40 percent of American forces in Iraq.

"Our work reflects a significant triumph for the Guard, Reserves and their families," said Graham, chairman of the Armed Services Subcommittee on Personnel. "Now, after years of relative neglect, these soldiers' health care coverage and benefits are more in line with their service to our nation. This year's bill provides continuous health care coverage for all drilling reservists, an important improvement over what we were able to accomplish last year."

"I am pleased that we have made further progress towards our goal of increasing access of health benefits for our National Guard and Reserve and their families in New York and around the country," Senator Clinton said. "Providing the Guard and Reserves, as well as their families, with adequate support and benefits is the least that a grateful nation can do."

"We know how important it is that we fund our military hardware and base installations. At the same time, we can't ignore our military personnel. We can't ignore those who volunteer to protect us," stated Senator Mike DeWine. "It's the least we can do, particularly as we continue to rely more and more on our Reserve and National Guard."

Virginia Guard Soldiers Ordered to State Active Duty

October 11, 2005

BLACKSTONE, Va. - Approximately 40 Virginia Army National Guard Soldiers have been ordered to State Active Duty to assist local officials supply water to the town of Big Stone Gap, Va. The Soldiers began moving from their home locations to Big Stone Gap yesterday. The water distribution system is scheduled to be operational by this evening. A water shortage stemming from dry weather conditions and a water draw down because of a dam construction project on the Big Cherry Reservoir caused officials in this Southwest Virginia town to declare a water emergency.

Soldiers from the 1030th Engineer Battalion and the 1032nd Transportation Company located in Gate City; the 1710th Transportation Company located in Rocky Mount; and the 222nd Quartermaster Detachment located in Staunton have joined together to help their neighbors in Big Stone Gap through this water shortage. Soldiers have the capability to provide ten 20,000 gallon water storage units in Big Stone Gap. The Soldiers will be assisting with the distribution of bottled water at the Big Stone Gap Wal-Mart parking lot as well. They will also be assisting with the distribution of bottled water to special needs shelters in the Big Stone Gap area if requested.

The National Personnel Records Center has provided the following website for veterans to access their DD-214 online at <http://vetrecs.archives.gov>.

This may be particularly helpful when a veteran needs a copy of his DD-214 for employment purposes. Please see the details below.

The National Personnel Records Center is working to make it easier for veterans with computers and Internet access to obtain copies of documents from their military files.

Military veterans and the next of kin of deceased former military members may now use a new online military personnel records system to request documents. Other individuals with a need for documents must still complete the Standard Form 180 which can be downloaded from the online web site.

The new web-based application was designed to provide better service on these requests by eliminating the records center's mailroom processing time. Also, because the requester will be asked to supply all information essential for NPRC to process the request, delays that normally occur when NPRC has to ask veterans for additional information will be minimized.

Discount airfare for military families

United Airlines is offering reduced fares for active duty and reserve members of the Navy, Marines, Army, Air Force and National Guard. In addition, service members' spouses and dependent children are also eligible. These special fares are not available at the United Airlines website. To purchase the special fares, service members should contact United Reservations at 1-800-241-6522 and identify themselves as eligible for military fares.

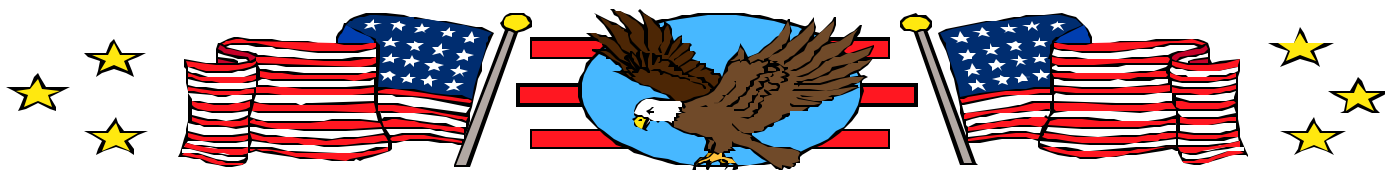

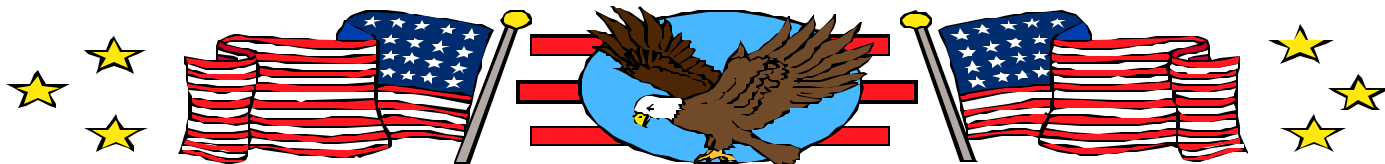
